
ANNUAL REPORT 2023

When a family does not have to worry about the immediate needs and expenses associated with hospitalization, they are given the freedom to rest and focus on what's most important: their health and recovery.

• Serve patients and their families who are at the greatest financial risk.

We are committed to serving under-resourced patients and their families. We can serve a patient from New York State, another state, or another country – so long as the cardiac surgery or transplant patient is being seen at one of our 9 hospital partners and is deemed low income.

• Support a patient in their ongoing recovery.

Post operative recovery is not always linear. Whether a patient is dealing with a prolonged hospital stay, bouts of organ rejection post transplant, follow up surgery, or another complication, Harboring Hearts can offer financial assistance to a family more than once, thanks to the generosity of our donors. This is essential as families strive for stability and independence.



"It's because of supporters like each of you in this room, that cardiac surgery and transplant patients and their families can continue to have hope and be blessed with benefits that will certainly make an impact."





Team Harboring Hearts stepped up to run 13.1 miles and take on the \$2,500 fundraising challenge.





PATIENT STORIES YEAR 2023

Thanks to the unwavering support of the LiveOnNY Foundation, we have expanded our programmatic reach to serve cardiac, liver, and pediatric kidney transplant patients via our Emergency Fund.



Sadio, Heart Transplant Recipient

Sadio received her heart transplant at 10 months old, before she and her twin were a year old. After her heart transplant, her family and nurses cared for her at home and at the hospital 24/7. However, years later she was confronted with an EBV virus which caused PTLD (Post-Transplant Lymphoproliferative Disorder). She received treatment at Memorial Sloan Kettering and Mount Sinai Hospital. At one point during her care, Sadio's dad lost his job as the sole worker in the home. Harboring Hearts helped pay their rent for a few months and groceries as well. Now, Sadio loves to discover different places, play sports, as well as be near her twin brother.



Roy, Pediatric Kidney Transplant Recipient

In December of 2019, Roy was born and then diagnosed with stage 5 kidney failure. After a three-year wait and three years of dialysis, a kidney became available and Roy received his transplant. During that time, Roy's mom remained by his side, missing work to be at the hospital and care for him. It was with the support of her family, and Harboring Hearts, that she found some relief. Through our Emergency Fund supported the family with food and transportation assistance at the time of Roy's transplant. Today, Roy is entering pre-k with a healthy appetite for learning and good food!



Rebecca, Liver Transplant Recipient

On September 12th, 2022, Rebecca received her liver transplant after battling cirrhosis of the liver. As a wife and mom of two, she was unable to work for over a year due to her illness pre-transplant. After her transplant she experienced what was thought to be rejection, but it thankfully turned out not to be. During her condition pre-transplant and post-transplant, her family stuck by her side to care for her. Through our Emergency Fund, we provided support to Rebecca and her family with hotel accommodations and food assistance so they could focus on caring for her while she recovered. Today, she is back to work and thriving thanks to her caring family and Harboring Hearts.
